b) WREN work update

This is the final year of WREN funding. Work will proceed as previously agreed. Uneconomical thinning work is scheduled to begin in August; planting work in October/November (with tree guards erected July/August); Rhododendron removal is currently out to tender with 5 contactors – the work being split into areas to provide the opportunity for each of the contactors to be engaged. Planting and removal of the Rhododendron would be more suited to volunteers. MF is to liaise with SP and DE.

8. Publicity, marketing and events

- Possibly representatives from Hill Holt youth programme.
- Two guided walks one at 4pm and one at 6pm to be led by Mark Feather plus a couple of Board members.
- Possible dates 16 or 17 August.

9. Wild about the Woods /Stronger Communities

WW had circulated his update report to the Board together with flyers detailing the large number of events planned over the summer. Additionally, there will be free drop in sessions in the woods every Thursday. Recruitment to the intern scheme is about to begin.

All the events will be publicised in the Barrowcliff Newsletter and BC can share via Big Local. All events will also be published on the website.

The Bushcraft event involves camping overnight in the forest. It was noted that there is currently a lot of wild camping in the forest which would be an issue for RWCE to deal with once it has the lease.

10 Making Local Woodlands Work (Plunkett Foundation)

a) Governance and Business Plan Review - Timescale

There had been a second Governance workshop which those who attended felt had been very productive. NL had spoken to Mark Walton (MW) following the workshop and provided an update to the Board on current thinking.

The emerging governance proposal is to have a separate trading company. There is now an urgent need to start the business but NL believes that RWCE is probably two years away from being able to set up a forestry operations business. Instead he is proposing that RWCE focus on an education enterprise instead.

The Area Opportunities Fund is targeting areas of high educational need with a total of £6millon over 3 years to be allocated to innovative education projects. NL proposed that RWCE could put in a bid to this fund to develop an education based green woodland enterprise to work with schools to provide opportunities for pupils struggling in mainstream education. The schools pay on a pupil by pupil basis and pupils receive vocational skills training which could then lead to formal qualifications. If successful the money could cover the cost of at least 3 employees (one with a chainsaw qualification). This could then lead to being able to attract other funding for specific improvements (eg paths, bridges).

The Board **AGREED in principle** for NL to explore the idea of the education based enterprise with the Area Opportunities Fund.
