	Anglo American have agreed to fund a new Forestry Operative role for 6 months to enable RWCE to actively harvest timber and generate an income.	
	 Following the site visit by Anglo American, they also expressed an interest in a potential longer-term partnership with RWCE and asked RWCE to submit a proposal based around ambitious nature restoration. PT arranged a workshop with key partner organisations including Natural England, NYMNPA and Forestry Commission. RWCE then submitted a £250,000 project proposal to Anglo American's Positive Biodiversity Outcomes grant scheme. 	
	 Natural England had offered a letter of support to the project as well as an offer of £5,000 match funding for the above project if it goes ahead. 	
	It was noted by all present that whilst this opportunity could provide a huge benefit to RWCE any grant offer would need to be considered from an ethical perspective by all members of the board.
